

KREC Application Checklist

**Broker - Inactive (formerly known as escrow) applying through License Recognition.
Applicant MUST hold an active broker license in good standing in another state.**

**All of the following requirements must be met for licensure. There are no exceptions.
Failure to comply with these requirements will void the application and you will be
required to retake the exam and/or redo the national criminal history check.**

- Original application completed and signed by the principal broker and applicant;
Applicants will receive the application from the testing provider after passing
the exam.
- Certificate of Licensure from the other state(s) must be attached;
A copy of the license is not acceptable.
- National Criminal History Check (original); *
The report must be on file with the KREC or attached to the application and
cannot be more than 90 days old at the time the application is submitted.
- Check for \$60 for license application made payable to the Kentucky State Treasurer.
- If the applicant is not a Kentucky resident, a "Consent to Jurisdiction and Service
of Process" form must be attached.

Please allow KREC three to seven business days after receiving all required items
(including the national criminal history check) to process the application. In the event
that a legal issue is identified in your criminal background check the time to process
may be longer.

*** PLEASE NOTE:**

- **The national criminal history check must be requested prior to scheduling the
exam and expires 90 days from the date it is issued.**
- **Once you have completed the exam, you will only have 60 days to apply
for your license.**
